Entry to the Infant and Junior School

To obtain a place for your daughter please contact the Head of Melbourne House, Mrs Jones, and she will organise a visit and a meeting. Places are offered following an informal assessment. Entry is normally at ages 4 and 7, though vacancies in other years do sometimes occur.

Progression to the Senior School

We expect that all girls who are offered places in Melbourne House will progress naturally to the Senior School. In the very rare cases where the work may be too demanding we discuss this with parents well in advance and never later than during Year 4.
